This list of references to published illustrations of avocado fruits is believed to be fairly complete (except for several undated nursery catalogs) for the varieties that have originated in California and those that have been introduced and had rather general trial here. It is presented because illustrations of many of these varieties are not to> be found in current publications, and growers and others frequently ask where they can find published views of some certain varieties in which they have become interested.

Illustrations of several of the older well known varieties have not been found and some of those here indicated are not generally available except in public or specialized library files. Information regarding published views in addition to those here listed will be greatly appreciated.

Only a very few of the more promising newer forms have yet been illustrated in publications but it is understood that the Directors of the Avocado Association hope to be able to present more of these in forthcoming Yearbooks.

The first column of numbers below refer to the publications in the list at the end of the variety names and the other figures show the volume and page where the illustrations appear. The symbol (1) indicates that only a side view of the fruit was published and **sect**, means that only a view of the section is given but unless one of these references appears both side and section views will be found. Letters A,B,C, etc., mean that the illustrations so indicated differ from one another.
