AVOCADO VARIETY CATALOG

Supplementary to Check List of Varieties published in 1950 Yearbook. The following list includes varieties omitted from the Check List and varieties registered by the Society in 1951.

AZTEC (Hybrid)

Originated, at least 25 years ago, as a seedling in the Rodiles grove, Atlixco, Mexico; first propagated Oct., 1947.

TREE—Vigorous grower, very precocious, very productive. FRUIT—Season: October-November (at Tegucigalpa, Honduras); Color: green; Weight: 10-12 ozs. Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thin; Flavor: good, nutty; Free from fiber; Seed: medium.

DECEM (Hybrid)

Originated at Carlsbad.

TREE—Much like Fuerte (probably a Fuerte seedling), cold resistance about same as Fuerte.

FRUIT—Season: same as Fuerte; Color: green; Weight: 6-8 ozs. Shape: pyriform; Skin leathery and smooth; Flavor: good; Seed: medium.

BACON (Hybrid) Registered 1948

Originated by James E. Bacon at N.E. corner La Palma and Grand, Buena Park, Calif., about 1928.

TREE—Tall and slender, consistent producer of heavy crops.

FRUIT—Season: January-March; Color: green; Weight: 10½ ozs.; Shape: ovoid; Skin: thin and smooth; Flavor: fair; Oil: 17.85% Oct. 1, 1948; Keeping Quality: good.

CATALI (Guat.) Registered 1947

Originated by Wm. J. Catalini it Fista, Calif., in 1928.

TREE—Upright, 32 feet tall, good producer, hardy.

FRUIT—Season: June-August; Color: green; Weight: 12 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thick, smooth, peels from flesh; Flavor: good; Oil: 19.4% June 30, 1947; Seed: 2% ozs.

EYMANN (Guat.) Registered 1947.

Originated by James Hornback, Carlsbad, Calif.

TREE—25 feet high with a 24 foot spread, bears 400 to 480 lbs. per year.

FRUIT—Season: August to October; Color: green; Weight: 18½ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thick and peels from flesh; Flavor: good; . Oil: 18.17% October 16, 1946; Seed: 3 ozs.

GEIB (Mex.) Registered 1951

Originated by John J. Geib, R. R. 1, Box 206, West San Bernardino Avenue, Redlands, California about 1931.

TREE—Shape is spreading; production, about 400 lbs. per year since 1940; cold resistant.

FRUIT—Season: September IS to December 15; Color: green; Weight: 5 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thin, smooth; Flavor: good plus; Oil: 27.1%; Keeping Quality: poor; Seed: medium.

GINA (Guat.) Registered 1951

Originated by Eugene S. Henry in 1927 at 254 South Lafayette Park Place, Los Angeles, California.

TREE—Tall, slender, and hardy.

FRUIT—Season: November through January; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thick, smooth, peels easily; Flavor: fair plus; Oil: 13%, March 9th; Keeping Quality: good; Seed: 2 ozs.

HALSTED (Hybrid) Registered 1948

Originated by D. D. Hoisted, 4527 West 169th Street, Lawndale, Calif. TREE—More upright than Fuerte.

FRUIT—Season: December to April; Color: green; Weight: 10-12 ozs.; Shape: ovoid; Skin: leathery; Flavor: good; Oil: 22.48% April 1, 1948; Keeping Quality: fair; Seed: 1½ ozs.

KAREN (Hybrid) Registered 1948

Originated 1933 on Foothill Road, Twomey Ranch, Vista, California. TREE—Upright.

FRUIT—Season: March to June; Color: green; Weight: 6-10 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thick, peels from flesh; Flavor: good; Oil: 24.15%.

KIMBALL (Hybrid) Registered 1951

Originated by W. C. Wilkins at 1452 Royal Oaks Drive, Duarte, California about 1931.

TREE—spreading, about 30 feet tall, hardy.

FRUIT—Season: October to March; Color-.green; Weight: 5¾ ozs.; Shape: obloid; Skin: thin, smooth, adheres to flesh; Flavor: good plus; Oil: 10.6% November 2, 1951; Keeping Quality: good; Seed: 1¾ ozs.

KING (Hybrid)

Originated at Whittier, California.

TREE—Upright and slender.

FRUIT—Season: December to January; Color: green; Weight: 8 to 10 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Flavor: good.

LODGE (Hybrid)

Originated at La Mesa, California.

TREE—Bearing at La Mesa, Fallbrook, and La Habra, California.

FRUIT—Season: December to February; Color: green; Weight: 6-10 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Oil: high; Seed: small.

MISTERIO (Mex.) Registered 1947

Originated by A. R. Chenoweth, Fallbrook, California, in 1944 (a bud mutation; may produce 2 crops annually).

TREE—Erect, hardy.

FRUIT—Color: purple; Weight 10%. ozs.; Shape: ovoid; Skin: medium thick and smooth, does not peel; Flavor: good minus; Oil: 19.78%, January 9, 1947; Keeping Quality: good; has fiber in flesh; Seed: 2 ozs.

MONICA (Mex.) Registered 1951

Original tree unknown. Present oldest known tree is 7 years old, located on Harlan Griswold Ranch at San Luis Rey Heights, Fallbrook, Calif.

TREE—Moderately upright, about 12 feet tall, yields in 1948, 1949, 1950, 1951 were 1½, 3, 1½, 2½ boxes (40 lb. boxes), hardy.

FRUIT—Season: October, November; Color: green; Weight: 8% ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thin, smooth, adheres to flesh; Flavor: good plus; Oil: 19.1%, December 7, 1951; Keeping Quality: good; Seed: 1½ ozs.

NUT (Guat.) Registered 1951

Originated by E. A. Tarbutton, 858 Hymettus Avenue, Leucadia, California, about 1926.

TREE—Erect, produced about 400 lbs. in 1951.

FRUIT—Season: April through June; Color: purple; Weight: 8½ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thick, pebbled, peels from flesh; Flavor: good minus; Oil: 19.50%, July 6th; Keeping Quality: good.

PAULINE (Mex.) Registered 1951

Originated by Paul Haskins, located /4 mile east of Newport Avenue, 3/8 mile south of Skyline Drive, Orange County about 1932.

TREE—25 feet tall with 15 foot spread, dense foliage, produces 18 40-lb. field boxes per year.

FRUIT—Season: January, February; Color: green; Weight: 9¾ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thin, smooth, peels from flesh; Flavor: fair; Oil: 9.2%, March 9; Keeping Quality: fair; Seed: 1¾ oz.

RINCON (Hybrid) Registered 1945

Originated by Sam Thompson at Carlsbad, California. Propagated by Stanley Shepard at Carpinteria, California.

TREE—Spreading, very precocious relative to bearing, somewhat alternating, but a very good producer.

FRUIT—Season: March to May; Color: green (darker than Fuerte); Weight: 8½ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: smooth, leathery, peels; Flavor: rich; Oil: 16.18%, March 30th; Seed: 1½ ozs.

ROCK (Guat.) Registered 1947

Originated by James Hornback, Carlsbad, California.

TREE—30 feet high with 33 foot spread, produced 600 lbs. in 1941.

FRUIT—Season: August to October; Color: purple; Weight: 16 ozs.; Shape: ovoid; Skin: very thick, peels; Flavor: fair minus; Oil 17.28%, October 11, 1946; Seed: 3 ozs.

ROSA (Guat.) Registered 1951.

Originated by Wm. T. Hatfield on ranch near Fallbrook about 1944.

TREE—Upright (9 feet tall) drooping limbs, produced 20 to 80 lbs. fruit during years

of 1947 through 1951.

FRUIT—Season: May through September; Color: green; Weight 21 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thick, smooth; Flavor: good; Oil: 16.4%, April 6; Keeping Quality: good.

SILLIMAN (Hybrid)

Originated on Silliman place in La Habra Heights and propagated by Walter Beck, Kashlan Street, La Habra Heights, California.

TREE—Nearly central leader type tree, consistent bearer, a little less frost resistant than Fuerte.

FRUIT—Season: May through June; Color: green; Weight: about 6-8 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: corky, leathery; Flavor: good; Seed: medium.

SORPRESA (Mex.) Registered 1947

Originated by Jacob Ter Veer at Santa Monica, California about 1937.

TREE—20 feet high, spreading, averaged 150 to 175 fruit from 1947 to 1951.

FRUIT—Season: September to November; Color: purple; Weight: 11¼ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thin, glossy, does not peel; Flavor: fair; Fiber: some; Oil: 16.89% November 7, 1946; Keeping Quality: good; Seed: 2½ ozs.

TANTLINGER (Hybrid) Registered 1947

Originated by Mrs. Jean H. Tantlinger, Newport Road, near Dodge Ave, Santa Ana, in 1933.

TREE—Upright, tall, consistant producer (largest yield 150 lbs.), a Fuerte seedling, hardy as Fuerte.

FRUIT—The season, color, average weight, shape and skin texture same as Fuerte; Skin: peels from flesh; Flavor: good; Oil: 19.9% March 5th; Seed: 1½ ozs

WESTWOOD (Guat.) Registered 1947

Originated by Allan M. Olds at Los Angeles in 1940 (located at 1245 Holmby Avenue).

TREE—Upright, tall production in 1945 was 40 fruits, in 1946, 200 fruits, and in 1947, 150 fruits.

FRUIT—Season: January to May; Color: green; Weight: 9¾, ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: medium thick and smooth, peels; Flavor: good plus; Oil: 22.16% on May 27, 1946; Seed: 1¾ ozs.

WILHORNE (Mex.) Registered 1951

Originated at the Citrus Experiment Station, Riverside, California as a seedling of the Puebla variety, by Prof. W. T. Horne and reported by him in the 1942 Yearbook of this Society.

TREE—Tall, upright, bears regularly, resistant to frost.

FRUIT—Season: November to February; Color: purple; Weight: 6½ ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: thin, does not peel; Flavor: good; Oil: 18.7% March 9th; Seed: 1.3 ozs.

WRIGHT (Hybrid)

Originated in the city of Whittier.

TREE—Spreading, frost resistant, production satisfactory.

FRUIT—Season: October, November; Color: green; Weight: 6 to 8 ozs.; Shape: pyriform; Skin: quite thin; Flavor: good minus; Oil: high; Seed: small.
